2007 Webmaster Annual Report

The 2007 State and District Officers' (table) website was updated and posted soon after the annual state meeting. The 2007 Plan of Works were received from Committee chairs and posted prior to the end of 2006. Bylaws and Policy and Procedures were updated as directed following the 2006 state meeting.

Minutes received were posted to the home page. Those included: Mid-Year Board Meeting, January 18, 2006; the Annual Board of Directors Minutes from August 15, 2006; and the Annual Business Session from August 16, 2006.

Home page was utilized to make announcements to the membership. Retired pages continue to be updated by Hope Hunt, former web master and FCE Agent, Mecklenburg County.

Almost all 2007 POW Annual Reports and District Presidents' Annual Reports were posted prior to the 2007 state meeting.

The Awards pages were updated as information became available. These pages were completed and "secretly" posted. Following the awards banquet at the state meeting, the site will be revealed on the web. The Awards chair will notify the members of the site's URL.

2007 Annual State Meeting web pages including registration, hotel and workshops information were posted and revised in a timely manner.

Our Association's domain name (nceafcs.com) and forwarding without masking ability continues. Approval was given to pay Hope Hunt, former webmaster, for domain services. The amount this year was \$10 with renewal in April 2007. Cost of services was budgeted.

Continue to reorganize the NCEAFC's web files and directories. Reviewed and edited linked pages to make sure all links worked. A site analysis for NCEAFCS.com can be found at <http://intra.ces.ncsu.edu/webalizer/nceafcs/>. This program generates web statistics and is automatically updated each month. There were over 3986 visits or 332 per month, to our web site during the past twelve months. This compares to over 10,043 visits (837 per month) in 2005-2006. Utilization of the web is falling: 13871 for 04-05; 10,043 for 05-06; and 3,986 for 06-07.
