### 2009 Awards and Recognition Annual Report

1. State Awards co-chairs and District Vice President were provided with description of responsibilities for awards and recognition. E-Mail was used to distribute contact information of Awards and Recognition Committee.
2. District Vice-Presidents were asked to encourage member agents to plan for submitting awards as they were working on their end of year reporting.
3. Group A and B Awards chairpersons received information about awards judging process, state judging sheets, and awards information & national judging sheets from NEAFCS by e-mail attachments.
4. Awards information was posted on the NCEAFCS web page when available from NEAFCS.
5. Judging sheets – awards tally sheets, awards winners sheets, and awards summary sheet were created in word processing files that will be saved to a disk for future reference.
6. State chairs for Group A & B awards distributed award applications to their respective committees of District Vice Presidents for judging, using the scorecard provided.
7. Winning applications and scorecards were sent to the State Vice President of Awards & Recognition and eligible applications were forwarded to NEAFCS Awards and Recognition Chairperson for judging at National level.
8. Twenty-three plaques were ordered from Trophies and Tributes: (5) 9 x 12 plaques for Past State President, Distinguished Service, Continued Excellence; (8) 8 x 10 plaques for winners of other awards; and (2) 7 x 9 plaques for team members-NCCE. Team leader winner for Community Partnership Award and Mary W. Wells Memorial Diversity Award purchased (8) 7 x 9 plaques for NCCE team members who were non-members of NEAFCS.
9. All awards recipients received information about the state awards presentations and encouraged to invite their CED, DED, and guests for the Awards Banquet.
10. Summary statements were emailed, as an attachment, to appropriate state executive committee members for publishing in the state meeting program.
11. State award winners will be posted on the NCEAFCS website following the state meeting.

12. National winners will be posted after the NEAFCS meeting. North Carolina has association members who will be recognized as national winners: Three (3) Distinguished Service Awards recipients and (One) 1 Continued Excellence Award Winner.
