2010 Proposed Policies and Procedures Changes Proposed By Law Changes

Section 3. State Life Members

- A. Any former Extension employee who has been a member of the State Association for at least 5 years, upon retirement or disability, will be granted State life membership upon payment of a one-time fee as described in Policies and Procedures.

Proposed Change:

- A. Any former Extension employee who has been a member of the State Association for at least 5 years, upon retirement or disability, will be granted State life membership upon payment of a one-time fee as described in Policies and Procedures and to pay state dues each year in order to help support the State association.

Proposed Policies & Procedure Changes:

QUALIFICATIONS FOR STATE OFFICE:

1. Nominees for State Office will stand for election on the basis of their qualifications.
2. Any candidate for a State Office must be an Active member in good standing of this Association and have served as President of a District, except Treasurer who should have served as a District Treasurer.
3. No campaigning will be allowed prior to or during the Annual Session. Each candidate for State Office will be introduced at the Annual Business Session prior to the election of officers.

Proposed Change:

2. Any candidate for a State Office must be an Active member in good standing of this Association and have served in the same capacity at the district level, or a comparable position in another state. State Vice President for Public Affairs shall have served as District President.

FINANCES:

1. District Treasurer shall collect and pay dues to the State Treasurer for each active member by the State-established deadline. The State Treasurer shall pay dues to the National Treasurer by the established deadline for all active members. Dues are non-transferable and non-refundable. The membership year is from January 1 to December 31 inclusive.
 - A. national dues shall be \$60.00
 - B. state dues shall be \$57.00 beginning in 2010 and includes \$1.00 for the support of the Horn Of Plenty and \$1.00 for the support of the NCECA Scholarship
 - C. district dues shall be set by the district.

Proposed Change:

B. state dues shall be \$57.00 beginning in 2010 and includes \$1.00 for the support of the Horn Of Plenty and \$1.00 for the support of the NCECA Scholarship. State Life member dues will be \$57.00 beginning in 2011.
