4-H Stats and Facts

- 3,490 Mecklenburg County young people, grades K-12, participated in 141 different 4-H led programs or groups.
- 88% of Mecklenburg County 4-H participants increased subject matter knowledge.
- 129 community volunteers contributed time and energy to support 4-H programs in Mecklenburg County.
- 4-H provides research-based curriculum in over 100 different subject areas including financial literacy, photography, health & fitness, and electricity.
- Nationally, more than 6.8 million youth benefit from 4-H experiences.
- The 4-H Youth Development program is active in all of the nation's 3,067 counties.

How Do I Participate in 4-H?

- Community Clubs— volunteer-led groups of youth learning together in their community. These clubs can be held in community centers, recreation centers, libraries, churches, or personal homes.
- After School Clubs— 4-H clubs led by trained school-age care professionals in an after school setting.
- Special Interest — short-term focused learning in a small group, day camp or after school setting.
- School Enrichment — partnerships with Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools enrich elementary school science classrooms with 4-H's "Magic of Electricity" and "Embryology" curriculum.
- Overnight Camps — one week experiences away from home where youth learn self-discipline, environmental responsibility, healthy lifestyles, and marketable skills.
