About the Training

Foresters and other natural resource professionals are challenged by landowners interested in forest management that promotes environmental stewardship and produces multiple benefits. In addition, the FLEP program calls for new and updated cost share programs including practices such as timber stand improvement, and educational programs on forest health and invasive species. Because of these two factors, foresters and other natural resource professionals need the information and tools necessary to effectively incorporate multiple forest management practices into their work to meet landowners' objectives. This workshop will provide attendees with the needed information and techniques to effectively implement crop tree management, timber stand improvement practices, improve forest health and face invasive species issues. The course will include both class room instruction and field exercises with extensive examples and applications.

Who Should Attend?

This course will be valuable to forestry and other natural resource professionals in the southeast whose work involves incorporating varied forest management practices to achieve multiple landowner objectives, improve forest health, and deal with invasive species issues. Two additional courses will be offered in the near future focusing on forest land management and similar training in the Piedmont and Mountains of North Carolina.
