

**Prime Considerations for Forestry Professionals: Ethics and Liability**

**Program**

Many professionals are required to take at least one contact hour of ethics continuing education annually. Though not required in North Carolina, a review of the NC State Board of Registration's Code of Ethics can help foresters work through some tough situations.

A serious consideration we face when planning forestry operations is exposure to liability risks. This teleconference will help identify insurance coverages that can protect us from these risks.

**Topics and Speakers**

**Derryl Walden** is retired Deputy Director of the NC Division of Forest Resources. He served three terms on the NC State Board of Registration for Foresters (NCBRF) between 1991-1994 and 1995-2001. Derryl will call upon his experience as a public forestry professional, and his understanding of the origin of the NCBRF Code of Ethics to start out our program for today.

**Gary B. Blank** is a Associate Professor of Forestry in the Department of Forestry and Environmental Resources at NCSU. His research concerns environmental impact assessment and historical ecology, and he teaches courses in environmental impact assessment, sustainable use of natural resources, and historical environments. Gary will walk us through a case study in applied forestry ethics.

**Eddie Campbell** is the Agency Manager for Forestry Mutual Insurance Company of Raleigh, NC. Eddie has 14 years of commercial insurance experience in the timber and wood products industry. He was a practicing industry forester for the previous 16 years. Eddie will cover the subject of liability in forestry operations with additional focus on prescribed burning liability.
