### New to 4-H?



One of the trickiest parts of being a 4-H'er is figuring out your "4-H age". The following is a guide for you to go by:

Regardless of when your birthday falls within the calendar year, whatever age you are on January 1st is your 4-H age for that entire year. For instance, if your birthday is August 15th and you turned 15 in 2012, on January 1, 2013 you are 15 years old and that is your 4-H age for the entire 4-H year of 2013. Take a minute to calculate your 4-H age.....Still confused? It can be tricky, and that is why you can always contact the 4-H office with any questions at 862-4591.

Other Bladen 4-Hers entered their artwork in the Artastic Competition. Some of our county's winning entries included:


**Olivia Miller** 3rd place in the age 9-10 fine arts category.

#### **AIRE**



#### :JWhat is AIRE?

ARIE stands for **Application, Interview, Resume, and Essay**. It is an opportunity for 4-Her to practice skills (resume writing, interviewing, etc.) they will need for college and career AND it's also the way that NC 4-H chooses delegates for super-fun trips to **National 4-H Congress, National 4-H Conference, and International Leadership Conference.** 

#### Who Can Participate?

**4-Hers ages 11 – 18 can participate in AIRE**. Youth ages 11 - 13 participate in a non-competitive ARIE process and are not eligible to win the National trips. **Youth ages 14 – 18 compete for the national trips**. All participants get really good

feedback from judges and participating at a younger age allows a 4-H'er to better position themselves for a more competitive AIRE submission once they are old enough for the national trips. Remember – 4-H Age is determined as of Jan 1, 2013.

#### **Due Date** — **MAY 8, 2013**

AIRE packets are due to the Bladen County 4-H Office by 5 PM on May 8, 2013. (Note: If you see a May 15th deadline on paperwork or the NC 4-H website, that's because May 15th is the state deadline. Bladen 4-H staff need applications by May 8th so that we can proof everything and get it entered into NC 4-H's online system and delivered to NCSU by May 15th).

#### How to Enter?

The first step in the AIRE process is to fill out the attached application. Be sure to complete the Mock AIRE application in either Word or PDF format. NC 4-H will review applications and contact youth to set up the next step of the process, the Interview if youth make it to the second round of the contest. AIRE interviews will take place on June 24, 2013.
