What is an e-cigarette?



Vaporizes a nicotine solution, contained in the cartridge, to create a mist that is inhaled.

Many different types





Makers have different strategies

Some want it to look, feel, taste like a traditional cigarette

Some want it to be clearly distinguishable from a traditional cigarette

Some do <u>not</u> want to even call it a cigarette

Commonly Cited Reasons for using e-cigs:

- 83% because they perceived e-cigs to be less toxic than traditional cigarettes
- 79% to aid in satisfying tobacco craving
- 66% to deal with tobacco withdrawal symptoms
- 57% cheaper than smoking
- 46% to help with quitting smoking
- 43% to avoid bothering others with smoke
- 39% To deal with situations where I can not smoke

(3037 in survey)

E-Liquid: nicotine solution used in e-cigarettes

- Currently nicotine is derived from tobacco
- Usually dissolved in solution of propylene glycol, vegetable glycerin, or polyethylene glycol
- Synthetic nicotine is currently expensive to manufacture and, in the U.S., would be regulated as a pharmaceutical instead of a tobacco product

Manufacturers

- Invented in China
- Many e-cigarettes are manufactured in China
- Growing quantity manufactured in U.S. where eliquid comes from U.S. suppliers...but this doesn't necessarily mean it is derived from U.S. tobacco

Health Advocates: Divided

"What we are doing first is tracking, and we are seeing some very concerning trends. Use of ecigarettes in youth doubled just in the past year, and many kids are starting out with e-cigarettes and then going on to smoke conventional cigarettes."

CDC Director Dr. Thomas Frieden

"This is basically what I would call a harm reduction strategy," said Michael Siegel, a <u>public health</u> professor at Boston University

Regulation

- FDA-Tobacco Products Center will regulate...no indication of how yet
- EU Tobacco Products Directive...initial proposal would have regulated as a medicinal.

Parliament rejected...new amendment which includes restrictions on age at purchase (18), bans internet sales, ingredient reporting, health warning, advertising ban, specs on nicotine content, additive restrictions

Regulation

- FDA regulation could be similar to proposed amendment to EU TPD
- Restrictions are being implemented by some states and municipalities
- Over-regulation could stifle and maintain smokers in traditional cigarette market
- Moderate regulation could benefit companies manufacturing in U.S.

Taxation????

E-Cigs is in **Infancy**; both in technology and market

- U.S. E-Cigs retail sales projected to reach \$1.8 billion by end of 2013 (source: Wells Fargo Securities)
 - Volume projected to grow by over 30% annually (Wells Fargo)
- U.S. Tobacco Products Market,
 2012: \$108 Billion in retail sales (source: Euromonitor)
 - Declining in volume...about 4% this year (TMA)
 - Revenues still growing...forecast to grow 1.4-2.7% in 2012 (Euromonitor)

Market Projections:

 E-Cigs may surpass traditional cigarette sales in volume by 2047 (Bloomberg)

 E-cigs may surpass traditional cigarette sales in volume by 2023 (Wells Fargo Securities)


E-Cigs are a Disruptive Technology

- Change may be dramatic, but is difficult to forecast
- Technology and characteristics of market may change dramatically
- Many companies in start-up phase (over 250), but consolidation will occur...a few winners and many losers
- "Big Tobacco" has entered market

Will E-Cigs be the product that takes the smokers' market?

- E-cigarettes are the current emerging technology for nicotine delivery
- Do e-cigs help smokers quit or just cut down (and maybe keep them smoking)
- But other "reduced risk" products are being developed e.g.
 - Ploom: heats tobacco but does not combust it
 - PMI is developing products that heat tobacco but do not combust it
 - Will these deliver a more satisfying experience to smokers than e-cigs?

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- E-cigs will be both a way for smokers to stop smoking and to get their nicotine where they can not smoke...i.e. e-cigs are a viable substitute for traditional cigarettes. Are they also a complement?
- How quickly and how much market share will e-cigs take from traditional cigarettes????

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
