

2014 Beekeeping Topic: "Beekeeping in Colonial Times Deadline to enter: Friday, February 14 All entries must be submitted electronically.

To the earliest European settlers in the New World, honey bees were an important part of their existence. Cargo manifests show that honey bees were among the first shipments of animals. How were they shipped? Why were they important? Why were they so important to the colonists? How does that differ from today?

The scope of the research is an essential judging criterion, accounting for 40% of your score. The number of sources consulted, the authority of the sources, and the variety of the sources are all evaluated. Historical research will be important. The more authoritative the source, the

better. Personal interviews with beekeepers and others familiar with the subject are valued sources of information and should be documented. Sources, which are not cited in the endnotes, should be listed in a "Resources" or "Bibliography" list.

Note that "honey bee" is properly spelled as two words, even though many otherwise authoritative references spell it as one word.

All participants will bring their one show hen to the NC State Fairgrounds for registration on October 15, 2014. This competition is open to any NC youth between ages 5-18 who will be in grades K-12 on the day of the show.

There is a limit of 300 participants due to space at the State Fair and the availability of turkey poults. The first 300 participants who pay the \$10 registration fee (for each person not for each poult) after they have registered online, will have poults reserved for them. Turkey hen poults will be available for pick up, on June 12th and 13 th, from 9:00am to 5:00pm, at the NCSU Animal and Poultry Teaching Unit.

Cloverbuds ages 5-8 are also encouraged to participate, but they will not be judged on a competitive level.

Top winners at the district level will be invited to present at the state level at NC4-H Congress in June. Depending on category, winners will receive cash prizes, medals and scholarships to attend Congress. \*\*<u>You must present to either a club leader or at County Activity Day</u> <u>before attending District Activity Day.</u>
