- 8) Engagement in learning

We are gearing up for a great 4-H Congress 2014! I know our youth are looking forward to this great event. Please see below for information about this event. As more details are finalized, those will be shared with you. If you have any questions, please let me know. 4-H Congress is designed for teens ages 13-18

Dates: The dates for Congress this year are June 21-24, 2014

Location:

- * We are working to have presentations on NC State's Campus.
- * The candlelighting ceremony will be at Dorton Arena.
- * All other events will be at the Jane S. McKimmon Center.

Cost:

- * Option 1: Full time (Saturday Evening-Tuesday) registration will be \$170. This does not include lunch on Saturday.
- * Option 2: Full time registration WITH presentation day lunch on Saturday will be \$182.

Full time Option 1 registration fees cover registration, facilities, optional Saturday tour, Monday lunch, Monday dinner and Tuesday lunch. All other costs (including lodging) are additional.

Full time Option 2 registration fees cover registration, facilities, optional Saturday tour, Saturday lunch, Monday lunch, Monday dinner and Tuesday lunch. All other costs (including lodging) are additional.

Housing:

We will stay in the dorms at NC State, and the cost will be \$26.75 per person/per night. This fee includes breakfast the next morning at the dining hall.

TOTAL LODGING: \$80.25/person

Nametags:

This year we are enforcing that everyone must have an official Congress nametag or an event ticket to attend any part of this event with the exception of presentation day and Honor Club tapping on Saturday night.
