Project Record Books & Achievement Plans

We have moved the due date for Project Record Books to January 22nd and Achievement Plans to January **31st**. The forms for your Project Record Books and Achievement Plans can be found at the following website: http://alamance.ces.ncsu.edu/categories/4-h-youth-development/. Achievement Plans are listed under "Award Forms" and Project Record Books are listed under "Project Record Forms." Remember, your 4-H Age is how old you are as of January 1, 2013 (last year). You (the 4-Her) are completing this project for the year of 2013, so that's why it asks for your age as of Jan. 1, 2013. Honor Club & College Scholarship Applications 🔞 🗽



If you are a 4-Her who is interested in applying for NC 4-H Honor Club and/or a 4-H College Scholarship, those applications need to be turned into Erin by Friday, January 17. The NC 4-H Honor Club is the highest honor a NC 4-Her can achieve and recognizes those individuals who have had an exceptional 4-H career. To be eligible to apply for Honor Club, 4-Hers must be at least 16 years old as of January 1 and have been in 4-H for 3 or more years. They must complete the application (posted on our website).

4-H College Scholarships are available to 4-Hers who are applying to college this fall. The application is posted on our website. There is also a Scholarship Guide posted online with details about each scholarship offered and eligibility requirements.

If you are a 4-Her who is interested in either of these items, please let Erin know and she will be glad to assist you in completing these applications.

Blueberry Plant Sale Fundraiser







We will again be selling blueberry plants this February as a fundraiser for our county 4-H program. The proceeds from this sale will go towards 4-Her scholarships that you earn by par-

ticipating in things like Project Records, Talent Show, etc. These proceeds will also help fund our county level events and activities. So be sure to talk it up! The deadline to order plants will be Friday, February 14 and they will be available for pick up on February 21, from 10 am-3 pm and February 24, from 8 am-5 pm. The cost of the plants will be \$6 each, which is a great price! Varieties include: Climax, Onslow, Powder Blue, Premier, Tifblue, and new this year is Ira.

4-H Clover Spotlight (formerly 4-H Shines)

Alamance County 4-H Clover Spotlight will be held Friday, February 21 at People's Memorial Christian Church at 7:00 pm.

This is a fun night where 4-Hers can showcase their many talents on stage or off. There will be talent acts and a fashion revue, and on display will be artwork entered by 4-Hers.

Anyone that participates will receive 4-H scholarship money. This is a great way for young people to express their creativity. If you plan to participate in the 4-H Clover Spotlight, you will need to submit your entry forms by Friday, February 7. If you are entering the fashion revue or visual arts, you will also need to submit your garments/artwork along with your entry forms. These items will be judged ahead of time. That way, you will be able to take your items home with you the night of the talent show.

Who: ALL 4-H Youth ages 5-18



Cards & Cookies Update

On **December 7**, Alamance County 4-Hers came together to decorate Christmas cookies and make Christmas cards as a way to "give back" to our community. There were 119 bags of cookies (476 cookies in all!) donated to the Allied Churches homeless shelter and 33 decorated cards donated to Alamance Community Services. This marks 6 years of Cards & Cookies in Alamance County, and it's a great way for our youth to learn about giving back, although it's hard to resist eating those yummy cookies!
