Person County 4-H is currently selling Fraser Fir wreaths as a fundraiser for the local 4-H program. Wreaths are \$20 each and they come from Pardue Tree Farm in Sparta, NC. These wreaths are hand crafted onsite and have an outside diameter 20-24 inches. You will not be disappointed.

This year, there is an added bonus for our 4-Hers! For every wreath you sell, you earn \$5 of Clover Cash. So, if you sell 5 wreaths, you will earn \$25 in Clover Cash, which can be used for things like Summer Fun, Teen Retreat, Camp, Congress, etc. Think about what you might want to participate in during the coming year and how much Clover Cash you might want to raise to help pay for those events.

Planning, recording, and reporting are all important life skills that completing record books can help develop.

As a reminder, there are sample record books in Beth's office, as well as pictures

of what record books look like on the Person County 4-H Facebook page. New Cloverbud record book forms are also going to be uploaded to the Extension website. Cloverbuds are 4-Hers ages 5-8 years old.
