Seat Weaving February 18 & 19	Complete the hand caning of your chair's seat. Just bring your chair, free of all old cane, and we will go thru the 7 courses of weave to complete the seatwith minimum confusion. NOTE: • Bring the chair to be caned minus all the old caning • Count all the drilled holes in the perimeter • Measure the size of the drilled holes in the widest area • Measure the distance from the center of one hole to the center of the next hole. Do this in several areas as it may differ especially in older chairs. The reason for these statistics is it determines the size cane to be used. There are 6 different sizes. If total removal of old cane involves disassembling (removal of screws, etc) we can do this in class.
