How much are contracted pounds down for 2015??

- **-15%**

Acreage & Production for 15, 20, & 25% Reduction in 2015 Contracted Pounds

% Cut in Pounds	-15%	-20%	-25%
Contracted Pounds	408 million	384 million	360 million
Production at 10% Overage	449 million	422 million	396 million
Acreage	204 thousand	192 thousand	180 thousand


Assumptions:

- 480 million pounds contracted in 2014
- 2,200 lb/acre average yield

So what's causing such a large reduction?...


- Global supplies?

Global Supply: U.S., Brazil and Zimbabwe Flue-Cured Tobacco Production



Imports: Domestic Use of U.S. Flue-Cured Tobacco & Imported Tobacco




Declining Cigarette Consumption



Tobacco products will undergo a technological revolution over the next 5-10 years

- Non-combustibles could dominate traditional combustibles in the U.S. and EU
- Will e-cigs or "heat-not-burn" products dominate?
 - E-cigs: very different tobacco required
 - "heat-not-burn:" high quality tobacco needed...& maybe substantial quantity needed
- US & EU combustible sales may be heavily impacted

U.S. Unmanufactured <u>Exports</u> of Flue-Cured Tobacco (lbs farm weight)



Real Commodity Exchange Rate for US Tobacco






