4-H Summer Fun is sponsored by North Carolina Cooperative Extension and provides day classes and trips designed to encourage youth to learn new things, develop new skills, and explore new interests. The activities are open to all youth ages 5 & older and outlined in this brochure. Programs are taught and supervised by NC Cooperative Extension staff and 4-H & Community Volunteers. If you have questions about any of the activities, call 465-8240. Classes are held at the Catawba County Agricultural Resources Center in Newton, unless otherwise specified. Trips depart from the same location unless otherwise specified.

June 23- 25	Clover Camp - Each day features a theme with lots of different hands-on activities, theme snack, and special guests to help younger children learn different topics.	\$15	9-12pm	5-8
June 23	College Trek – Focus on your future and think about life after high school. Discover differences and features and areas of study offered by some nearby colleges as we visit Gaston Community College and Gardner-Webb College. Learn forensics techniques such as forensic insects, fingerprint analysis, impression analysis for tires and shoes, hair analysis, DNA evidence, blood spatter, and blood typing (synthetic blood is used). Field trips include the County Courthouse, as well as the animal diagnostic laboratory. There will be special speakers and a visit with a drug dog. This 30-hour ACT prep course will allow students to improve our ACT test taking skills, ease your test anxiety, and improve your chances for college scholarships and acceptance. You can qualify to receive up to a \$100 refund of your course fee, based on completion of the four practice test and weekly class attendance.
