Announcing the 2016 Regional Poultry Project! Formerly Chick Chain.

Orientations and training's are in the planning stages. ALL youth interested in participating must have 2016 4-H Enrollment and Medical Releases on file by February 1, 2016. Forms and money are due in our office by January 12th. Make checks payable to Bladen County Cooperative Extension.

The Regional Chicken Project is an opportunity for youth in FFA and 4H in the Cape Fear Region to learn more about the livestock industry. Through this project, youth will get to choose hens or broiler chicks to purchase at a discounted rate. The birds will be raised and youth will complete a project record book to record their care and knowledge about chickens. In May, the youth will participate in a Regional Chicken Show, where they will demonstrate to the judge their knowledge of the bird. Training for this will be provided through workshops or classes. At the end of the project the youth will have the opportunity to donate their broilers to the pss for local food pantries or keep for their own processing. The hens can be kept to lay eggs for a potential egg business or the hens could be sold for profit.

We are going to participate in Bladen Counties orientation on January 26th at 6 pm. We will leave the office at 4:00 pm and stop for fast food. I can drive the 15 passenger and one other 4-H volunteer can drive E-150 if needed. RSVP no later than January 22nd.




The Christmas Wreath Fund raiser was such a
