To provide growers and other members of the agricultural community with up-to-date information on crops, technologies, and crop production related practices.




# Impacts of Event

## The Participants


- 155 in attendance with a total of 207,125 acres of cropland represented.
- 33 farmers received pesticide license credits.
- 26 commercial pesticide applicators received a total of 52 credits, which preserved a total of \$161,200 in wages and saved them \$1,040 in registration fees.
- 15 exhibitors comprised of local, regional, and national/international agribusinesses participated.
