Some of her community service activities is volunteering with the soup 'n' sandwich dinners for seniors, spring and fall paper clover campaign, donating supplies to Backpack Buddies, doing crafts with residents at Meadowview Terrace and donating personal care items to the high school. You will also need additional money for meals that are not included in registration cost.
