4-H Event Scholarship Applications due April 1, 2019

Rowan County 4-H is now offering opportunities for youth to receive additional financial support to attend 4-H events.



Cloverbucks are earned scholarship vouchers awarded to any 4-H'er for participation in particular 4-H activities. These vouchers can be used to offset costs associated with 4-H trips and events. We have outlined several areas where youth can receive Cloverbucks. Please note that youth WILL NOT receive actual cash in hand through this process.

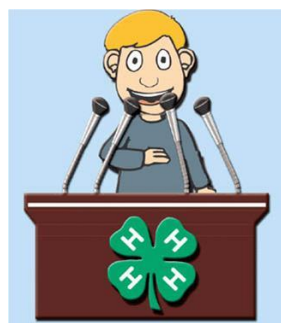
Additionally, we have outlined parent costs associated with overnight 4-H trips and programming that are offered through the county office. These costs are what the parents will owe for these particular events; 4-H will be covering the remaining balance for each of the outlined trips.

A scholarship program has also been created for youth to apply for additional funding to offset parental costs for any 4-H opportunity offered through the county 4-H program or through 4-H clubs. A youth can receive no more than \$150 annually through this scholarship process. Youth may not receive the full amount they ask for; it will be at the discretion of the scholarship committee based upon the application, scholarship money available and number of applicants.

Rowan County 4-H Scholarship Applications are due APRIL 1, 2019 to the Rowan County 4-H Office.

4HOnline updates

4-H'ers and 4-H volunteers MUST ENROLL in 4HOnline ANNUALLY. The 4-H year runs from January-December, which means you must re-enroll 4-H'ers NOW to make them eligible for 4-H in 2019.

4HOnline is a new enrollment system and those involved in 4-H in 2018 were just put into this system in November. I realize that was only a couple months ago, but it's a new year and a new time for re-enrolling.

Please login ASAP and get 4-H'ers enrolled. You are not an active 4-H if you are not in this system. You cannot compete, receive recognition, get scholarships, etc. if you are not enrolled in 4HOnline for 2019.

The website is nc.4honline.com. All new members must complete the entire form. Those members who enrolled in 2018 will just have to update their forms and fill in a few areas...much of the information is still in the system from 2018.

Horse Updates

1. The 4-H Horse Judging competition is on April 13. We have 3 4-H'ers competing. Thanks to Maggie Boreman and Cheryl Correll for all of their hard work in practicing with youth and lining up practices for youth. Thanks also to Cindy Stewart for instructing youth as well.

2. The requirements for getting a horse eligibility card have changed. Any 4-H horse member who wishes to show their project animal must have a valid eligibility card that is distributed through this system, which also will declare which qualifying show they will attend. After emailing the NC 4-H horse folks for clarification, **youth can compete in 4-H horse shows if they are in any type of 4-H club OR if they are at-large members.**

You MUST complete this google form (linked below) in order to receive an eligibility card. This form MUST be filled out by April 1, 2019.

Teen Leadership Club Reports

On January 23, the Leadership Club met at the South Rowan Library in China Grove. We held elections. Emily Barlow was elected President. Holly Wallace was elected Vice President. Kaitrin Boone was elected

Secretary. Laura Nettles was elected Reporter. Logan Loflin and Jady Safrit were elected Photographers.

After elections, Charles Nettles taught Parliamentary Procedure. We learned how to make a motion, how to amend it, how to amend amendments, and the order of business for meetings. We learned about how to conduct a meeting. He also told us stories that happened in his life that illustrates how important Parliamentary Procedure is. He gave us an example of Parliamentary Procedure by having us make trail mix using motions to decide on the ingredients.

On February 6, the Leadership Cub met at the Agriculture Center. Carol Nettles led a session about defining and identifying different types of leadership. We spelled out our names on pieces of paper and then went around and came up with different leadership traits that start with that letter of our name. We tried to build towers with different kinds of leadership. Also, we discovered what type of shoe we are, whether we are a work boot, sneaker, or a dress shoe.

On February 20, the Leadership Club met at the Agriculture Center. Carol Nettles led a session about SMART goals and how to achieve them. We learned what a SMART goal is, how to form one, and how to see one through. We played a game where someone was blindfolded in a team and the other had to guide them from one spot to another without bumping into anything. We also played a game where we had to get hula-hoops around in a circle without letting go of each other's hands. We then split up into teams and tried to build towers of marshmallows, dry spaghetti, string, and a length of tape. We had to put a marshmallow on top without it falling.

How to Start a New 4-H Club!

Are you interested in starting your own 4-H club to meet the needs and interests of your family or community? If so, here are the requirements to charter a new 4-H Club:



1. Must have at least 1 approved volunteer to lead the group (having co-leaders is also recommended). Volunteers must fill out an application and go through a background check.
2. The club must have at least 5 members from at least 3 different families.
3. A written program of work must be completed for the first 6 meetings and must be submitted to the county Cooperative Extension office.
4. The club is organized with appropriate youth leaders that are either rotated or elected.
5. A club roster is completed and submitted to the county Cooperative Extension office.

An approved 4-H charter application must be on file at the Rowan County Cooperative Extension office and each club must re-charter annually. 4-H members must fill out 4-H enrollment and medical forms annually.
