Seeking New Leader(s) for Teen Leadership 4-H Club

The Teen Leadership 4-H Club started in September 2018. The volunteer leaders who began this club no longer have the time necessary to lead this club and are trying to find someone new to lead this club for 2019 and beyond! Could it be you?!?

This club is for teens who are interested in developing their leadership potential. In 2018, club members made resumes, participated in mock job interviews, learned parliamentary procedure and more!

The new leader(s) would be able to pick meeting location, day of the week and time for each of the meetings. Leaders would be responsible for organizing or leading the educational activity for each meeting. Leaders work closely with the club members to plan and organize all club meetings. Clubs must meet at least once a month (some clubs take off during the summer) and must have at least 6 business meetings per year.

To lead a club, volunteers must: -enroll in 4HOnline at nc.4honline.com -pass a background check -attend annual 4-H volunteer training conducted by the 4-H agent

There is some paperwork due annually for clubs. Each club must conduct at least one service project per calendar year and leaders must attend at least one 4-H training per calendar year.

For our 4-H Club Leaders:

-All 4-H volunteers and club leaders: **PLEASE make sure you report your contacts for each month. They are due by the 10 of the month after the month you are reporting for.** Your May report is due June 10. Please do your other monthly reports too if you have not completed them already. <u>http://go.ncsu.edu/2019monthly4hreport</u>

-At the office, there is a notebook with your printed 4HOnline enrollment forms for all those who are signed up to be in your club in 4HOnline. **PLEASE PICK IT UP SOON!** These should be with you at all 4-H functions and should be locked up when not in use.

-<u>It is ok for individual clubs to do fundraisers or seek out donations</u> for their club. **HOWEVER, Laura must know ahead of time.** If you are planning a fundraiser for your club, please notify Laura of your plans before you get too deep into the planning process. If you are seeking donations, please notify Laura of this as well (we don't want our county program and multiple clubs to be seeking donations from the same folks every time).

-If your club receives money (donation, club fee, etc) the money <u>MUST be</u> <u>RECEIPTED and TURNED IN to the Extension office within 3 DAYS of</u> <u>receiving it!</u> If you need a receipt book, please let Laura know.

-All 4-H Club accounts are currently under the 4-H PALS account umbrella. **If you are seeking reimbursement from your club's account OR if you are needing money out of your club's account to pay a bill**, please follow the new format that was presented at the February PALS meeting. You must fill out this <u>PALS money use</u> form. For personal reimbursement, please bring that form with a copy of the receipt to the Extension office to give to Laura or to Melva. It will then be turned over to Carole Massey, PALS treasurer, who will cut you a check.

-Please push your 4-H'ers to do a project record book, Achievement Plan or to get involved in 4-H in a new way!

-As a reminder, if you, your club Reporter or a parent have any brief information or a 4-H picture & caption that you want published in the newsletter, please send it to me by the 25th of the month prior to the newsletter publishing date (which is typically the 1st of the month).

-Don't forget that your club MUST do at least 1 service project in 2019. Read the "From the Agent" section, the Feed the Hunger Flyer and the Sock Drive info section of this newsletter for 3 upcoming service opportunities!

-Remember that as a club leader, you MUST attend 1 volunteer training during the calendar year to be able to re-charter your club. For Emerald Seal, you must attend 2



volunteer trainings.

What is a **PACKATHON**?

A Packathon is a hands-on service event where participants team together to produce thousands of life-saving meals for hungry children both here and around the world.

People ages 5-105 work to assemble together four ingredients: rice, soy protein or pinto beans, dehydrated vegetables, and vitamin powder. These ingredients are repeatedly bagged, weighed, sealed and boxed during a two-hour shift.

Feed one child for up to an entire school year in just two hours!

On May 25th, the 4-H "Hot Shots" got an opportunity to attend and assist in the Memorial Day Flag Placing Ceremony at the Salisbury Cemetery. We chose a few of the fallen veterans to recognize and acknowledge.

Darryl Barnes served as a U.S. Army Sergeant in the Persian Gulf War. He was born April 16th, 1960. He lived to be 55 years old and passed away on Thursday, December 17, 2015. Our other veteran is Glen Boroughs. He was born May 5, 1931. Glen became a U.S. Navy solider and served his country proud in the Korean War. On February 13, 2012 Glen passed away, leaving behind his loving wife, children, and grandchildren.

These are just two of the many veterans that were served and honored by 4-H and all of the other groups who came out, supported and placed the flags on the graves of these veterans. This was a very good opportunity for all of us, to be able to honor our soldiers and veterans who have passed.

"Best Tomato" will be judged by medium size, smoothness, stem in the center and sits right on top, firm and not mushy when sliced, best flavor

"Longest Zucchini" will be judged by measurement end to end, stem not included

"Longest Beans" will be judged by the longest 5 beans placed end to end for a continuous measurement. Beans must be all the same type

"Oddest Shape Potato" will be judged by shape and any appendages

"Most Unique Vegetable" is open to any vegetable and will be judged by oddity, including color, shape or any appendages

Entries must be grown by the entrant and cannot be purchased.

One entry per category, per person

How to Start a New 4-H Club!

Are you interested in starting your own 4-H club to meet the needs and interests of your family or community? If so, here are the requirements to charter a new 4-H Club:

1. Must have at least 1 approved volunteer to lead the group (having co-leaders is also recommended). Volunteers must fill out an application and go through a background check.

2. The club must have at least 5 members from at least 3 different families.

3. A written program of work must be completed for the first 6 meetings and must be been submitted to the county Cooperative Extension office.

4. The club is organized with appropriate youth leaders that are either rotated or elected.

5. A club roster is completed and submitted to the county Cooperative Extension office.

An approved 4-H charter application must be on file at the Rowan County Cooperative Extension office and each club must re-charter annually. 4-H members must fill out 4-H enrollment and medical forms annually.
