4-H Camp is for youth ages 8-14. It is an 5 night, 6 day overnight camp from a Sunday-Friday during the summer. We officially have camp dates and a location! We will be going to Betsy-Jeff Penn in Reidsville, NC on June 28-July 3, 2020.



It's time to register for camp! The registration form (linked below) and non-refundable payment of \$150 is due by March 25 to reserve your spot.

For youth ages 12-14 who are interested in the Adventure or Trekker program at camp, I recommend that your register before March 25 as those camp spots are limited and fill up FAST!

Camp costs \$420 per person. 4-H'ers who are active in a 4-H club or multiple county level events for at least 6 months prior to the registration date will owe \$375. If we receive donations from local groups, the cost may be less per person, but we will not know that until closer to time.

Teen Retreat (for youth ages 13-18 as of Jan. 1)

Teen Retreat will be on March 7-8, 2020 at Millstone 4-H Camp. This is a district 4-H event (we are in the South Central District). This weekend will include workshops and the campaigning and election of district officers. We will leave on Saturday morning and return on Sunday afternoon. The total cost is \$95, but 4-H pays a portion of that cost. Those who attend will owe **\$50** for the trip.

RSVP by February 12 if your child plans to attend. The \$50 payment is due no later than March 7 (when we leave).

Our own Jaysa Causby will be campaigning and running for South Central District Vice President, so it'll be great to have several teens go from Rowan to help her and cheer her on!

More details will be shared as I get them.

Citizenship Focus (for youth ages 14-18 as of Jan. 1)

Citizenship Focus is a leadership and citizenship conference for NC 4-H'ers. This year's conference will be held in Cary, NC on June 15-17. Only <u>3</u> youth per county can attend. Rowan County pays in full for this event (\$200) for each participant, while the NC Electric Cooperatives pay the remaining fees for each child (total cost per attendee is over \$600). It is FREE to you and is a wonderful experience! Conference highlights include: Citizenship themed workshops, panel discussions, distinguished speakers, visits with elected officials, community service projects, and off site visits in Raleigh.

If you are interested, please email laura_allen@ncsu.edu. no later than May 1. Those who have never attended before will be given first preference, but repeat attendees are invited to attend again. It is limited to 3 Rowan County 4-H'ers.

4-H Congress (for youth ages 13-18 as of Jan. 1)

4-H Congress is the highlight of the 4-H year at the state level! 4-H'ers attend workshops & leadership sessions, listen to motivational speakers, participate in the process of electing officers, conduct community service projects and more! We stay on the campus of NC State University for this event. We will leave on Friday, July 17 and return on Tuesday, July 21. If you plan to attend 4-H Congress, please RSVP by May 1. Congress will cost \$175 per child with the county covering the remaining cost (total cost is over \$300 per child).



Those involved in this program will be provided with the following supplies during the project: incubator with built in thermometer (\$135 value), chick life cycle kit, fertilized eggs, curriculum, life cycle poster, chick feed. All supplies and chicks will be returned to Rowan County 4-H at the conclusion of the program.

Those involved with this program will have to provide the following items for this project: brooder

box (a plastic tote works fine), shavings (can use shredded paper/newspaper, sand, etc), and heat lamp/bulb. This should be of minimal cost to you as you hopefully have most of these things at home or school already.

At the required training, all teachers will be trained on the incubation process to help ensure project success. At the conclusion of the training, all teachers will get the supplies they need for the project (including the fertilized eggs) and will take them home with them that night. The eggs have to stay at 68-70 degree Fahrenheit until the next day when you will incubate them, so plan accordingly. To participate, teachers MUST attend this training. If a teacher participated in the 4-H Embryology program in 2019, they can come at 4:15 to pick up their supplies instead of attending the 3:30 training. However, I still recommend they come to the training to help ensure a successful hatch.

Application, Interview, Resume, Electronic-Video (AIRE)

AIRE is a workforce development and college prep program for youth ages 11-18 (as of Jan. 1).



Youth are eligible participate in this program in one of two ways.

Option 1: Youth participate in this program by completing the four (4) AIRE candidate packet components. All candidates submitting a complete packet will be invited to participate in either the State-Level competitive program (open to youth ages 14-18) or in the non-competitive program (open to youth ages 11-13). Youth participating in the competitive AIRE program are eligible to be selected to attend national events such as National Congress, National Conference, and International Leadership Conference.

**This option requires youth to submit their packets to Laurano later than June 1, 2020.

Option 2: Youth participate in this program by completing the AIRE program components as selfstudy and/or as part of their local 4-H program. This option does not require the participant to submit their AIRE packet for State-level review.

Horticulture Opportunities

NC 4-H Beekeeping Essay: Due March 15

Honey Bees are harbworking, tirelessly gathering nectar and pollen to share with their hive. They provide a vital ecological service by pollinating agricultural, garden and native plants. Explore more about these fascinating insects by participating in the North Carolina 4-H Beekeeping Essay contest. The essay provides a platform for youth to creatively express their working knowledge and research of the craft of beekeeping.

2020 Beekeeping Essay Topic

"Overwintering: Bee Survival through the Cold Season"

Honey bees have developed special skills to overwinter in the United States. Please discuss one of these skills and then include a discussion about what you do to prepare your hives for winter. Include a photo of one of your hives, either using infrared technology or showing winter wrap, hay bales, special feeders, etc. to demonstrate how you prepare your hives for winter.

Essay Guibelines

The scope of the research is an essential judging criterion, accounting for 40% of your score. The number of sources consulted, the authority of the sources, and the variety of the sources are all evaluated. Personal interviews with beekeepers and others familiar with the subject are valued sources of information and should be documented.

North Carolina 4—H Beekeeping Essay Contest Rules

- The contest is open to active 4-H Club members only. 4-H'ers who have previously placed first, second, or third at the national level are not eligible; but other state winners are eligible to re-enter.
- Requirements (failure to meet any one requirement disqualifies the essay)
 - Write on the designated subject only.
 - Essay must be typewritten or computer-generated on single-sided pages and formatted following standard manuscript format using double-spaced type and 12pt font in legible font face
 - Length: 750 to 1000 words. Note: Youth that are in the 9-10 age category, only need to write an essay that is between 400-500 words.
 - Word count does not include sources, works cited or the writer's biographical statement.
 - All factual statements and interview references must be cited in a "sources" or "bibliography" list.
 - On a separate page, please include a brief biographical statement of the writer including mailing address, email address and phone number.
- Essays will be judged on (a) scope of research- 40%; (b) accuracy- 30%; (c) creativity- 10%;
 (d) conciseness- 10%; and (e) logical development of the topic- 10%.
- 4. NC 4-H youth will compete in the following age divisions; 1). 9-10 2). 11-13 and 3). 14-18. Youth awarded first in the 9-10 and 11-13 category will recieve \$25 each. Youth in the 14-18 age category will recieve \$50 and their winning essay will be sent on to the national competition. Youth can only place first one time within an age category.

National 4—H Beekeeping Essay

The winner of the North Carolina 4-H state Beekeeping Essay is forwarded to the national Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees to participate in their national essay contest. Each state 4-H Office is responsible for selecting the state's winner and should set its deadline so state judging can be completed at the state level in time for the winning state essay to be mailed to the Foundation office by April 1st, 2020. No essay received after April 1 will be considered. Each state may submit only one entry.

Final judging and selection of the National Winner will be made by the Foundation's Essay Committee, whose decision is final. The National Winner will be announced June 1st, 2020. All National entries become the property of the Foundation and may be published or used as it sees fit. No essay will be returned. National winning essays will be posted at the Foundation for the Preservation of Honey Bees 4-H Essay website. National prizes include: First Prize: \$750.00, Second Prize: \$500.00, and Third Prize: \$250.00.

ALL OFFICIAL 4-H VOLUNTEERS: Please report your 2020 contacts by the 10th of every month after the month for which you are reporting (January reports are due by Feb. 10): http://go.ncsu.edu/2020monthly4hreport



-The 4-H year runs January-December. <u>All volunteers and club members</u> <u>MUST be re-enrolled in 4HOnline in January 2020</u>, regardless of when they registered in 4HOnline in 2019.

- -If you are seeking reimbursement from your club's account OR if you are needing money out of your club's account to pay a bill, please use the PALS money use form.
- -Your club is encouraged to do fundraisers! Please let Laura ahead of time to make sure it won't conflict with another 4-H fundraiser and to make sure all receipting requirements are being met.

- -It is OKAY for your club to seek donations. **However**, please notify Laura of this as well (we don't want our county program and multiple clubs to be seeking donations from the same folks every time).
- -If your club receives money (donation, club fee, fundraiser money, etc) the money MUST be RECEIPTED and TURNED IN to the Extension office within **3 DAYS** of receiving it! If you need a receipt book, please let Laura know.
- **-Please use the 4-H Club Leader Resource folder** (link emailed to club leaders). No need to "reinvent the wheel" when we have great resources we can share! If you don't have access and would like to have access to this folder, email Laura!
- -All of your club members MUST be enrolled in **4HOnline** in order to participate in 4-H! You are REQUIRED to keep a copy of each 4-H'ers enrollment form with you at 4-H club meetings and events and to keep them locked up when not in use. Contact Laura if you are missing any enrollments.
- -Please push your 4-H'ers to do a project record book, Achievement Plan or to get involved in 4-H in a new way!
- -Brief club information and/or a 4-H picture & caption can be submitted for the newsletter. Please send it to me by the 25th of the month prior to the newsletter publishing date (which is typically the 1st of the month).
- -Don't forget that your club MUST do at least 1 service project each year!
- -Remember that as a club leader, you MUST attend 1 volunteer training during the calendar year to be able to re-charter your club. For Emerald Seal, you must attend 2 volunteer trainings.

How to Start a New 4-H Club!

Are you interested in starting your own 4-H club to meet the needs and interests of your family or community? If so, here are the requirements to charter a new 4-H Club:

- 1. Must have at least 1 approved volunteer to lead the group (having co-leaders is also recommended). Volunteers must fill out an application and go through a background check.
- 2. The club must have at least 5 members from at least 3 different families.
- 3. A written program of work must be completed for the first 6 meetings and must be been submitted to the county Cooperative Extension office.
- 4. The club is organized with appropriate youth leaders that are either rotated or elected.
- 5. A club roster is completed and submitted to the county Cooperative Extension office.

An approved 4-H charter application must be on file at the Rowan County Cooperative Extension office and each club must re-charter annually. 4-H members must fill out 4-H enrollment and medical forms annually.
