#### Meat Suite

MeatSuite is an online marketing tool to help customers easily find locally produced meat in bulk. Whether you normally sell in whole/halves/quarters or by the retail cut, we hope that you will join MeatSuite by creating a farm profile and listing bulk meat products for sale. Please keep in mind, a large purchase may not be in the budget for some customers, so consider putting together a few options for bulk boxes at various price points. By offering some bulk boxes at various price points (i.e. \$50, \$100, \$200) you can include a variety of cuts that helps you move more than just the prime cuts.

### Updates and Openings

#### Pesticide Credit Options:

Live online classes are now eligible for pesticide credit. Attendance via webcam or smartphone camera is required to earn pesticide credit. These classes are open to all applicators and can be found by searching "online" in the Approved Continuing Education Courses calendar. Online classes will have "Online" listed as their address and city. See the course calendar listing for approved pesticide credits and fee information. Additional classes may be available through your local Cooperative Extension office.

If your certification date is 6/30/2020, 5 self-paced online training opportunities are available for a limited time. These online trainings are NOT an option and you will NOT receive credit if your certification date is anything other than 6/30/2020. These classes cannot be repeated for additional credit. Cost: \$15/each. Each class will earn 1 hour of pesticide credit in the following categories: A, B, D, G, H, K, I, L, M, O, N, T, and X. REMINDER: In order to recertify, your credits cannot all be earned in the same calendar year.

#### NCDA Agronomic Division Soil Testing Lab:

Although longer than normal sample turnaround times may be expected, we are accepting all routine client samples (soil, nematode, plant, waste, solution and soilless media) except waste samples covered by the NCDEQ waiver on liquid animal waste. Waste codes covered by the NCDEQ waiver are for lagoon liquid (ALS, ALF, ALP and ALO) and slurry (LSD, LSB, LSS and LSO). Diagnostic samples for all labs will continue to be prioritized

for fast turnaround time. Soil Test Forms and Information

#### NC State Plant Disease and Insect Clinic

Open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 a.m.-4 p.m.

Contact Amy-Lynn or Michael if you need to send plant samples in.

All samples must be sent by mail or other delivery services (UPS, FedEx, etc.). It is best to send samples that will arrive earlier in the week, as packages that arrive later may deteriorate before we can retrieve them. To help clinic personnel track incoming samples, it is beneficial to provide us with details about when packages are shipped, the method or carrier, and expected delivery date on the online sample submission form (provided in the comments section).

# The clinic will not be accepting out-of-state samples. The clinic will not be accepting physical samples from home and commercial landscapes.

\* Please limit physical sample submissions to situations where significant damage is occurring or is likely to occur. If the issue at hand is causing only minor damage, or if you have any doubt about potential damage, feel free to submit it as a digital image sample for clinic personnel to assess remotely. If possible, we encourage digital image samples be submitted in lieu of a physical sample. Furthermore, images are important to augment physical samples that are submitted.
