Granulate Ambrosia Beetle Alert



With temperatures rising to 70 degrees F and above this week for 5 days, I expect our first major ambrosia beetle movements of the year to stressed trees. Movement should occur across most of Eastern NC by Thursday or Friday, March 11-12 and activity should continue through Saturday, March 13. Keep in mind that water stress is a key contributing factor to attacks and we have plenty of that right now. I have included a few links below as reminders when battling ambrosia beetles.
