

Summer Junior & Cloverbud Leaders

Youth ages 14-18 can apply to serve as Junior Leaders. Junior Leaders help to lead summer day classes throughout June, July and August. Other roles include daily office tasks such as phone calls, data entry, copying and paperwork management. May plan and implement entire classes with appropriate support and interest level. No minimum time requirements, no experience necessary. Youth serving over 60 hours will earn higher ranking for 4-H trip scholarships. Youth ages 10-14 may serve as Cloverbud Leaders. These youth will work with the 4-H Afterschool program and Cloverbud camps to instruct activities, assist with setup, planning and logistics at day classes. No experience necessary. Generally, this is a one week time commitment.

Summer Intern

Seeking someone 18+ to help manage logistics for our summer program. Will serve 2-4 hours a week in office, plus plan and instruct 4-5 day camps. Will manage Junior Leaders as appropriate, create evaluations for classes, file paperwork, make reminder phone calls, and computer registration program. Must be computer-savvy with good personal skills. Apply at the 4-H office or contact Tracy_lecompte@ncsu.edu Stipend may be available pending 4-H Foundation approval of funds.
