2022 HORSEBOWL QUESTION SUBMISSIONS

What is the best way to study for Horsebowl? Where are the best places to find Horsebowl questions to study? These are questions that we are often asked by coaches, leaders and 4-H'ers when preparing for 4-H Horsebowl contests. There are several methods that can be used to prepare and each group and/or team should use what works best for them and their situation.

The first step in preparing to compete in NC District and State 4-H Horsebowl is to submit 40 questions to NCSU Extension Horse Husbandry by **January 2, 2022**. Questions must be submitted in the [County Submitted Questions Excel Template](#) or [Google Sheet](#) that is provided and only come from the [approved references](#). Be sure to include the page number for each question. The first tab on the spreadsheet file has detailed instructions on how to type in your questions and save and submit your file.

2022 YOUTH TEAM TRAINING CLINIC

Youth and adults interested in learning how to excel as competitors and coaches in competitive 4-H, FFA, and inter-collegiate horse judging contests are invited to attend the training session. Topics will include organizing and delivering oral reasons, formulating a judging system, and effective use of terminology. The training session will use a variety of video horse judging classes as a model for training on class placing and oral reason training. The clinic participants are divided into four categories based on their experience level (cloverbud, rookie, non-rookie, and adults/coaches) and are then divided into break-out groups that allow for individual attention and hands-on, critical thinking activities.

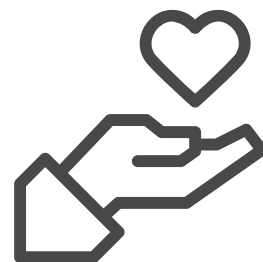
Registration is limited by group (Cloverbud- 20, Rookie-80, Non-Rookie 100). Priority and preference will be given to NC 4-H and NC FFA members. If space remains after January 2, other participants will be accepted on a first-come-first-serve basis.

2022 SPONSORSHIPS NEEDED

NEW for 2022 is an exhibitor sponsorship incentive! 4-H'ers that submit completed and paid sponsorships with their State Show Entry form will receive 20% of the sponsorship fees collected off their total show bill. For example, if a 4-H'er turns in \$1000 in sponsorships with their entry form, they can deduct \$200 off their show fees owed.

2022 RULES & REGULATIONS MANUAL

The new 2022 Rules and Regulations Manual will be available during the first week of the new year. All rule changes for 2022 are highlighted in yellow, so please scan through to sections that are applicable to you to see if there are any changes that may affect your competition division. There are a few minor rule changes for horse show divisions and some major changes for hippology. These changes were actually made for 2020, but due to the virtual nature of our contest last year this is the first year that they will be in effect in regards to team problem and stations (NEW!) phases. If youth competed as a Rookie in the virtual hippology contest in 2021, they are eligible for the Rookie division in 2022 or they may elect to move up to the Jr/Sr category. Also new in 2022 is a Digitally Created Art division for the artistic expression contest.

2022 NC 4-H Horse Program Achievement Applications

The NC 4-H Horse Program Achievement Award is an annual application/submission of accomplishments within 4-H, with a specific focus on horse program achievements that is cumulative beginning with the applicant's first year in the horse program

Applications are DUE March 1, 2022.
