At the above link, you will find the login link for 4-HOnline2.0. You will also find a link to a website that will help guide you through the new 4-HOnline2.0 system if you need assistance.

All youth who plan to participate in 4-H in 2021 AND all adults who plan to officially volunteer for 4-H in 2021 MUST be enrolled in 4-HOnline2.0 for 2021. Once you enroll, enrollment is good from now until December 31, 2021. Enrollment has to be completed annually.

The next and likely last group training opportunity on this topic will be on Tuesday, February 16 at 7 PM on Zoom.

**If you attended one of the trainings offered in November (in full), then you do not have to do this training again.

**To be approved as a 4-H volunteer for 2021, you MUST attend this training. Otherwise, you will have to train individually. This training must be complete by the end of April.

Please go to go.ncsu.edu/rowan4h2020participation for each child of yours who participated in Rowan 4-H in 2020. Those who fill out this form will have a certificate printed with their achievements listed on it and will receive a years of service pin.

Failure to complete this form means that your child's certificate will be only have their name & 4-H club and they will not receive a pin.

Do you plan to attend an in-person 4-H club meeting or event in 2021? If so, our NEW COVID PROTOCOLS require that 4-H'er and parent attendees do the following:

Step 1: Go to go.ncsu.edu/rowantrainingcomplete and watch the embedded training video. Each 4-H'er/parent who attends a 4-H club meeting or event MUST watch the video and EACH PERSON MUST fill out the form stating they completed the video training. This MUST be done before attending a 4-H event. Once you have completed it, it is good for each 4-H event moving forward.

Step 2: REGISTER IN 4-HOnline2.0 to complete enrollment and the latest liability waivers.

IF YOU ARE AN OFFICIAL 4-H VOLUNTEER, YOU MUST ATTEND A LIVE ZOOM TRAINING IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN 4-H IN A VOLUNTEER

ROLE. This training will go over all of the rules & guidelines that 4-H volunteers must adhere to. **Next training: January 19. Email laura_allen@ncsu.edu to get the Zoom link.**

Bee Hotel Build-a-Long

Bring some happiness to your garden and local bees by building a bee hotel



just in time for the spring!

Resident bee expert and Applied Ecology urban entomologist, Dr. Elsa Youngsteadt, will partner with Hill Library's Makerspace for this virtual build-a-long.

The first portion (~20 minutes) will be a talk by Elsa about the local bees in your garden and then the MakerSpace team will guide you through the process of building your very own bee hotel! We will be building this together during the webinar, so bring the materials with you and log in to the Zoom from where you will be building.

For the build: You can bring your own materials from a list provided at the link below. Or, for those who do not have saws and want to avoid a trip to the hardware store, there is a limited number of pre-cut lumber kits available for purchase, too (shipping to NC and surrounding states only). Kits are \$25 and must be purchased by February 15th.

NC 4-H 2021 Summer Camp Update

Rowan County 4-H is making plans to attend 4-H Camp at Betsy-Jeff Penn (BJP) in Reidsville, NC on **July 4-9**, **2021**. 4-H Camp is for any youth ages 8-14. If you register through Rowan County 4-H, camp will cost \$450 per 4-H'er...if you register through BJP, it costs more. You do not have to be a current 4-H member to attend.

Our three North Carolina 4-H Camps & Centers maintain accreditation from the American Camp Association (ACA). The ACA collaborated with an expert panel of specialists in pediatric medicine, camp medicine and nursing, epidemiology, infectious disease management, biological safety, industrial hygiene, organizational design and other technical specialists to produce the *Field Guide for Camps on Implementation of CDC Guidance* to assist in running safe and effective programs in the time of COVID-19. We are utilizing the *Field Guide* and are developing:



A pre-screening protocol for campers & staff before & during arrival



A process of daily health checks of all campers & staff once camp starts



PPE protocols for campers & staff in accordance with CDC guidelines



Modifications to programming & activities to ensure social distancing measures & safety protocols



A re-designed camper experience utilizing "cohorting" - keeping campers in consistent, small groups to limit exposure to others



Schedule modifications to allow additional time for safe hand washing practices before & after meals, activities, etc.



Modifications to dining hall procedures to ensure safety before, during & after mealtimes



Cleaning & disinfecting protocols in accordance with CDC guidelines, with the addition of new hand sanitizing stations around camp


