Achievement Night Plans for 2021 due to Covid-19.... RESPONSE NEEDED, LINK IS ON THE LEFT! Response due by Feb. 5.

Annually, we have Achievement Night in February to recognize the achievements of our 4-H'ers from the previous year. **We will do the same this year, BUT it will be virtual.** County Council has made plans to create a pre-recorded video that will air on February 23.

4-H'ers who participated in 2020 WILL still receive recognition via certificate and their name will appear on the screen during the pre-recorded video. Special awards will be given as usual.

An email will be sent out regarding pick up of 4-H Achievement Night awards following the video release. Do you plan to attend an in-person 4-H club meeting or event in 2021? If so, our NEW COVID PROTOCOLS require that 4-H'er and parent attendees do the following:

Step 1: Go to <u>go.ncsu.edu/rowantrainingcomplete</u> and watch the embedded training video. Each 4-H'er/parent who attends a 4-H club meeting or event MUST watch the video and EACH PERSON MUST fill out the form stating they completed the video training. This MUST be done before attending a 4-H event. Once you have completed it, it is good for each 4-H event moving forward.

Step 2: NEW waivers MUST BE FILLED OUT moving forward for all of our virtual and in-person programs. These forms are new as of Oct. 2020 and required by NC 4-H. Please fill out the appropriate forms linked below: <u>4-H'er Waiver</u> <u>4-H Volunteer Waiver</u> <u>Adult Attendee/Parent Waiver</u>

IF YOU ARE AN OFFICIAL 4-H VOLUNTEER, YOU MUST ATTEND A LIVE ZOOM TRAINING IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN 4-H IN A VOLUNTEER ROLE. This training will go over all of the rules & guidelines that 4-H volunteers must adhere to. Next training: January 19. Email laura_allen@ncsu.edu to get the Zoom link.



4-HOnline 2.0



NC 4-H 2021 Summer Camp Update

Rowan County 4-H is making plans to attend 4-H Camp at Betsy-Jeff Penn (BJP) in Reidsville, NC on **July 4-9, 2021**. 4-H Camp is for any youth ages 8-14. If you register through Rowan County 4-H, camp will cost \$450 per 4-H'er...if you register through BJP, it costs more. You do not have to be a current 4-H member to attend.

If your child is interested in attending 4-H Camp with us this year, please fill out this <u>registration form</u>. The remaining payment is due by Saturday, May 8 at 10 AM, which is the date of the parent meeting.

Our three North Carolina 4-H Camps & Centers maintain accreditation from the American Camp Association (ACA). The ACA collaborated with an expert panel of specialists in pediatric medicine, camp medicine and nursing, epidemiology, infectious disease management, biological safety, industrial hygiene, organizational design and other technical specialists to produce the *Field Guide for Camps on Implementation of CDC Guidance* to assist in running safe and effective programs in the time of COVID-19. We are utilizing the *Field Guide* and are developing:

A pre-screening protocol for campers & staff before & during arrival



A process of daily health checks of all campers & staff once camp starts



PPE protocols for campers & staff in accordance with CDC guidelines



Modifications to programming & activities to ensure social distancing measures & safety protocols



A re-designed camper experience utilizing "cohorting" - keeping campers in consistent, small groups to limit exposure to others



Schedule modifications to allow additional time for safe hand washing practices before & after meals, activities, etc.



Modifications to dining hall procedures to ensure safety before, during & after mealtimes




Cleaning & disinfecting protocols in accordance with CDC guidelines, with the addition of new hand sanitizing stations around camp
