Please know that 4-H must follow the protocols set forth by NC State and Rowan County, which are also based upon the governor's mandates.

This should be filled out if youth participate in any virtual program (clubs meetings, 4-H Congress, etc). June 15-21	Get Fit!	Most miles completed wins! Take a picture/ screenshot of miles completed in the week to submit as proof. You can use apps like Strava or any other running app. You can walk, run, or hike to complete miles.
June 22-28	Free Week	Free week, there will be no activities for this week! We hope you are participating in the NC 4-H Virtual Camp Out!
June 29- July 5	Patriotic Week	Complete TWO of the following: 1. Visit a historical landmark, either in person or online. 2. Make a sign to say why you are proud to be American. 3. Take a picture of something made in the USA.

July 20-26	Be Green	Complete the following activities 1. Recycle 2. Pick up litter for 30 minutes 3. Plant a bee garden a. Plant flowering plants: lavender, marigold, mintetc b. Make a bee bath (shallow container with water and pebbles or twigs)


