Dear Friends,

This has been an unusual and trying year, especially when the summer 2020 camping season was cancelled in the interest of health and safety for all. As we look to summer 2021, we are optimistic. Our North Carolina 4-H Camps and Centers hold and maintain <u>American Camp Association (ACA) accreditation</u>, demonstrating our commitment and adherence to the highest standards in the camping industry for safety, risk management, operations, programming and food service.

The ACA has worked tirelessly in 2020 to convene an expert panel of specialists in pediatric medicine, camp medicine and nursing, epidemiology, infectious disease management, biological safety, industrial hygiene, organizational design and other technical specialties to produce the <u>Field Guide for Camps on Implementation of CDC Guidance</u>, a handbook for camps on running effective and safe programs in the time of COVID-19.

While we must remain nimble in light of the ongoing pandemic, we are optimistic about the summer 2021 camping season. We are utilizing the *Field Guide* as we make modifications to our own policies and operating procedures at all three camps, to ensure the health, safety and well-being of our campers, their families and staff. Currently we are developing:

- · A pre-screening protocol for campers and staff before and during arrival
- · A process of daily health checks of all campers and staff once camp starts
- PPE protocols for campers and staff in accordance with CDC guidelines
- Modifications to programming and activities to ensure social distancing measures and safety protocols
- A re-designed camper experience utilizing 'cohorting' keeping campers in consistent, small groups during the week to limit campers' exposure to others
- Modifications to daily schedules to allow additional time for safe handwashing practices before and after activities, meals, etc.
- · Modifications to dining hall procedures to ensure safety before, during and after mealtimes
- Cleaning and disinfecting protocols in accordance with CDC guidelines, including the addition of new hand sanitizing stations around camp

With these measures in place and our commitment to safety, we look forward to returning to camp in summer 2021, ensuring our young people once again have the opportunity to disconnect from technology, grow self-confidence, build positive peer-to-peer relationships, and join the supportive community of our North Carolina 4-H camping program.

# NC 4-H VIRTUAL CRAFT FAIR

#### Purpose

- . Opportunity to share and demonstrate crafts you have been working on for your county fair or NC State Fair but were not able to enter them.
- · Allows youth to grow and practice their self expression & reflection while displaying creativity in their 4-H craft projects.

#### Who can Participate

. Open to all 4-H'ers 5-18 - Age is determined by Jan 1, 2020

#### Age Categories for Competition

- · CloverBud (5-7) (participation)
- Juniors 8-13
- Seniors 14-18

#### Categories

- · Paper Crafts scrapbooking, card-making, paper flowers, decoupage, papier-mache, origami, paper cutting etc.
- . Trendy Crafts tie-dye, use of ducktape, rock painting, beading, ceramics, latch hook, candle making, pottery, jewelry, etc
- Trash to Treasures Crafts recycling, taking supplies you already have, and making something crafty. Must submit a photo of the original item and one or two of the final product.
- · Drawing freestyle drawing, no tracing
- . Holiday Crafts any craft used for holiday decorating, etc.
- . Electrical Crafts any craft that has an electric power source (battery, plug, solar, etc)
- · Cookie Decorating decorate your favorite cookie
- · Cake Decorating be creative in how you decorate a cake.

#### **Guidelines for Participation**

- · Craft must have been made between January 1, 2020 October 30, 2020.
- · 4-H'er must have made the craft themselves
- 4-H'er must be enrolled in 4-HOnline in their county.
- · 4-H'er can enter up to two items per category.

#### **Judging Criteria**

- Age Appropriateness
- · Quality/Craftsmanship
- · Originality/Creativeness
- · Practicality and Usefulness

#### **Prizes**

. 1st - 3rd place for each age division (ribbons)

#### Timeline

#### Hay Bales Theme

Bales should be designed around promoting NC 4-H

- Suggested Ideas include but not limited to:
  - · Head, Heart, Hands, Health
  - Projects: STEM, Service, Outdoor Living, NC Culinary, Healthy Living
  - · 4-H Grows Here
  - 4-H Fall Harvest
  - NC Regions: Piedmont, Coastal Plains, Mountain

#### **Guidelines for Participation**

- · Rectangular hale bales should be used.
- Please limit your decoration to two (2) eight (8) bales.
- . Each entry must have a 4-H slogan that communicates the 4-H theme that has been chosen.
- . Entry must have the official 4-H clover or the words 4-H displayed somewhere on it.
- · Entries will be judged on 4-H message, eye appeal, use of materials, and creativity.
- The bales should be decorated with a good clean wholesome nature. No vulgar or suggestive decorations will be allowed.
- Decorations should be weather and wind-proof.
- · NO Commercial or Political party signs of ANY KIND are allowed.
- · A county can submit as many entries as you want.
- · 4-H members must be registered in 4-HOnline.
- The entry must be displayed.
  - Location may vary depending on your preference and approvals:
    - Extension office, home, other county buildings, library, school just to name a few. Just be sure to get permission if you are using a
      county building etc.
    - Only one family member/individual at a time can decorate if you are using a central location due to our 4-H restrictions at this time.
