Re: 2023 NC 4-H Horse Bowl Contest Questions

Hello everyone! We are looking forward to our 2023 NC State 4-H Horse Bowl and Hippology contests! Please forward the following NC State 4-H Horse Program information to your 4-H Volunteer Leaders, 4-H'ers and parents.

2023 NC State 4-H Horse Bowl Contest: Each county will need to submit 40 questions to EHH (Ilstroud@ncsu.edu) the linked Excel template or linked Google Sheet. The template has been revised from previous years; please make sure that questions are submitted with the most current version of the spreadsheet. There are drop-down selections for source titles that must be used. If a source is not on the drop-down list, then it is no longer a source. Questions are to be from the current reference list and must be e-mailed to Lori Stroud no later than Sunday, January 2, 2023 in order for your county to compete at their district contest. Questions should come from the official sources only and must include the reference and page number. Each question's reference must be documented correctly or additional questions will be required for resubmittal. The current references are listed on the EHH webpage. Please note: AYHC Horse Smarts and Horse Industry Handbook both had significant revisions published in 2021. Please make sure your book(s) are up to date before writing questions from those two sources. There are some reference changes for the 2023 Southern Regional and Eastern National 4-H Horse Roundup Horsebowl and Hippology Contests. These changes will not impact our 2023 contests, but will be implemented in 2024 NC State contests:

Specific references are to be used for questions at the district and state level for the Junior, Mixed and Senior Horse Bowl Divisions. Please note the questions submitted should be from as many of our listed resources as possible. In addition, questions submitted should be written for the Junior Division (using Junior Resources) and for the Mixed and Senior Division (using Mixed and Senior Resources). Also, make note of those reference changes when studying old questions.

Please do NOT reuse and resubmit questions from previous years. Questions for both the District and State contests are pulled from submitted questions. Also, please try to make your questions innovative, interesting and your answers accurate and complete. Please don't merely repeat questions word for word directly from the references! Try to put the "keyword or phrase" of the question towards the end, and do not make questions true/false or multiple choice. Please take a few minutes to read through the information found on this page: Preparing Teams for Horse Bowl Competitions. This page also contains hyperlinks to this memo, the

source list and the Excel spreadsheet file. Extremely wordy and overly difficult questions are rarely used. Please focus your attention on questions that would be suitable for rounds one through three.

Categories from which questions should be written and submitted:

- 1. Anatomy
- 2. Physiology and reproduction
- 3. Breeds and breed organizations
- 4. Psychology, training, and vices
- 5. Diseases and unsoundness
- 6. Parasites
- 7. Genetics
- 8. Tack and equipment
- 9. History and evolution
- 10. Trivia (limited to a maximum of two questions per round)
- 11. Nutrition
- 12. Judging and conformation
- 13. Showing, show procedures, and other mounted activities
