4-H is a fun and educational program in which participants "Learn by Doing." Kids complete hands-on projects in areas like agriculture, health, science, horticulture, and citizenship. Youth involvement in 4-H has proven over the years to increase leadership skills, community care, and provide needed life skills. Activities and programs will vary depending on age and ability level and are designed for boys and girls anywhere from age 5 all the way up to 19 years old.
