Position Description/ Responsibilities:

The Martin County Intern will shadow agents in all program areas and assist with major summer events. The program areas in Martin County in which the intern will gain experience are: Agriculture, 4-H, Local Foods, and Family and Consumer Sciences.

Interns will assist agents with program planning, development, implementation, and evaluation. Responsibilities may include: program supply organization, graphic design, 4-H day camp assistance, help with event registration, and program evaluation data collection.

- coursework in Agriculture, Extension Education, Health and Nutrition, Youth Development, or related fields is preferred.
