Role of the Extension Master Gardener™ Volunteer

The NCSU Master Gardener™ Program is an outreach of NC State University Extension Service. The Extension Master Gardener™ (EMG) program is an educational program designed to enhance public education in consumer horticulture using unbiased, research-based information. Under the guidance and direction of our Extension Agent Gene Fox, we provide educational assistance to the citizens of Beaufort County concerning lawns, fruits, vegetables, trees, and ornamentals through the utilization of our trained and supervised volunteer staff.

Previous formal training or exceptional gardening skills are not required for acceptance to the NC Extension Master Gardener™ Volunteer training program.

Program & Certification Requirements

The next training session is in the planning stages.

Initial Volunteer Training

- Minimum of 40 hours of instruction
- Classes are taught by Extension staff and local experts.
- A wide range of topics are taught from soils, various plant types, pests/insects, lawns, gardening, landscape design and much more.

Internship & Certification

- 40-hour internship is required
- Individuals participate in a variety of volunteer opportunities to reach this goal.
- Following initial training and internship, the volunteer is eligible to become a Certified NC Extension Master Gardener™ Volunteer.

Re-Certification

To remain active in the program, the volunteer must meet annual re-certification requirements which varies by county.
