HOW TO REGISTER

All Summer Exploring programs are free of charge this year. Registration takes place through Google Forms, beginning June 1st. Go to

go.ncsu.edu/pender4h_summer_registration2020 or scan the QR Code above!

Then, youth must enroll in 4-H prior to the start of the selected program. Enrollment is free, and can be completed at https://nc.4honline.com/. Reference the step-by-step guide, included at the end of this catalog, when enrolling in 4HOnline. If you have issues registering, please contact us.

ABOUT 4-H

4—H is a voluntary, educational program for youth ages 5-18. Our approach to youth development is through hands-on learning. **In 4-H**, we believe in the power of young people. We see that every child has valuable strengths and real influence to improve the world around us.

The three main program areas are STEM, agriculture, and healthy living. The four H's stand for Head, Heart, Hands, and Health.

Presentations Contest

Presentations are a huge part of North Carolina 4-H! It is one of the most successful ways to help a young person learn how to do a public speech. It focuses on members teaching others what they know about a particular project/subject matter. They are sometimes called demonstrations or illustrated talk or a formal speech.

There are many benefits to public speaking, including learning life skills, such as increasing public speaking skills, confidence, and knowledge in a subject matter.

Presentations should be approximately 5-12 minutes long and need to be in one single take. No editing is allowed! For more information, go to

July 20th: Final video due for State Presentation



TURTLE TRASH COLLECTORS

UNCW MarineQuest is offering this FREE virtual program for Pender County 4-H funded by the NOAA Marine Debris Program. This program is designed to educate youth about the impacts of marine debris and encourage behavior changes to reduce the generation of marine debris in the future.



FOR AGES 8-12 THURSDAY, MAY 28TH @ 2PM MONDAY, JUNE 8TH @ 12 PM TUESDAY, JUNE 16TH @ 12 PM

STUDENTS WILL:

- Virtually participate in a simulated sea turtle necropsy (animal dissection)
- See how trash in the ocean can impact sea turtles
- Learn how trash can get to the ocean
- AND learn how we can all help stop marine debris!

Students will also have a chance to become a Turtle Trash Collector and earn our digital turtle badges by collecting trash outside with the help of an adult. This is something families can do together to help us save the ocean, while also flattening the curve since they can practice social distancing while cleaning up their neighborhood.

JUST SAY "NO"!


The Health Rocks! Vaping Prevention Program, Just Say "NO"! is a healthy living program aimed at 11 to 14 year olds, with the goal of bringing youth, families and communities across the **United States together to reduce vaping** by youth. The goal is to prevent youth from vaping or stop vaping if it has occurred. The Vaping Prevention Program lessons are designed to teach your child about the importance of staying vape-free by identifying what vaping is, health effects resulting from vaping, personal strengths, and the power of advocacy. This guide gives background information on each beginning lesson and tips for talking with your child about vaping prevention.



Final Project: After attending the conference, participants are expected to work with their 4-H Agent to develop and implement an action plan utilizing the skills they learned during the conference. The tentative due day for the final project is August 10, 2020.

4-H REAL MEDIA

4-H REAL media is a curriculum to prevent adolescent substance use among 7th-12th graders by:

- increasing their knowledge of advertising techniques used to sell alcohol, tobacco, marijuana and other drug products
- developing their counter-arguing and critical-thinking skills in response to these messages
- helping them apply these skills and techniques to create youth-driven, antidrug messages

The activities are designed to be engaging and challenging. They encourage students to reflect and offer their thoughts via open-ended questions as well as quizzes and optional depth sections where students can further explore their interests. Each level ends with an interactive challenge that allows participants to apply new skills.

We are partnering with Brunswick County 4-H to offer this!



FOR AGES 12-17



WRONG! Worms are so cool and so helpful!! So what is vermicomposting? It reuses worms and micro-organisms to convert dead organize matter into nutrient-rich humus - aka, you feed your worms organic matter, and then you are able to use worm "castings" as fertilizer in your garden!


WEDNESDAY, JULY 28TH VIA ZOOM 3:00 - 4:00 PM

AGES 5 - 12

Youth will learn all about vermicomposting, how to create their own vermicomposting bin, what to feed your worms, and the benefits of vermicomposting.

CITIZEN SCIENCE PROJECT

Since the spread of COVID-19 and quarantines around the world, Mother Earth has started to heal. Air quality has improved and animals are returning to areas where they haven't been seen in a long time! We want to find out if marine debris has also improved and we need your help. By collecting data on litter in our neighborhoods, we can understand how COVID-19 impacts pollution and marine debris.



Here's how you can help:

- 1) Pick a place you can do a cleanup, perhaps your neighborhood, the local park, or the beach.
- 2) You will need to cleanup this route 3 times: once now, then again when quarantine restrictions are lifting, and once more when everything is reopened and back to normal.
- 3) During each cleanup, keep track of the trash you collect using a data sheet and report your data to us so we can keep track of everyone's progress!


You will receive the correct forms and more information after you register!

4-H ROCKS! - Take Home Exploration

4-H ROCKS! We have seven kits that allow youth to explore rocks! Are they sedimentary? igneous? Metamorphic? Is it shiny or dull? Is it rough or smooth?

Youth will receive a kit that includes various types of rocks, as well as a chart. You will also have access to a recorded video to help walk you through the activity.

Finally, we'd like to remind you that 4-H is a year-round youth development program. So, if you enjoy your summer, come back and be with us in the fall.


NC 4-H SUMMER CAMP OUT

By registering in a Summer Fun program, the parent/legal guardian of a participant agrees to: limit distractions, work with program staff to resolve any issues that may arise, keep the participant safe through-out the program, and ensure the participant logs-in on time and is prepared for the program. Five minutes into each activity session, the virtual meeting space will be locked and you will not be able to access the content. This is for security and safety purposes for participants.

4-H Agrees to: take attendance and allow only registered participants to participate, address problems that are brought to their attention, and ensure that all participants are treated with dignity, fairness and respect.

SETTING UP A PROFILE

You will be required to set up a family profile on **4HOnline**, the on-line North Carolina 4-H Enrollment and event registration program. The family profile will be where the members (Youth & Adults) will enroll. The website can be found at https://nc.4honline.com

If you need to create a family profile, select "I need to setup a profile," complete the fields required and click Create Login.

What happens if it says User account already exists? This means a family profile exists with that email address because your child was already enrolled through their local Extension Office. Select "I forgot my password" and a new password will be emailed to the email address on file. Please do not create a 2nd account! Then follow the steps on the tip-sheet, Re-Enrolling in 4hOnline.

Follow the instructions on the Family Information page and click Continue.

SET UP ONLY ONE (1) FAMILY PROFILE PER HOUSEHOLD!

After adding the family, add your family members to that family profile. Use the follow to determine the type of membership to add:

- · Adult: 4-H volunteers
- Youth: 4-H youth between the ages of 8 and 19 who are involved in a 4-H program

IMPORTANT! Adult records should only belong to adult volunteers.

For adults and youth, the next pages are authorization releases and health forms for risk management. These are important to have completed in case you get injured at a club meeting or 4-H event. If you have questions or concerns when filling out the forms, contact your **County Extension Office.**

When adding a club, select the club from the drop down and click "Add Club" button to save the selected club. Repeat the same steps to choose your project(s). Each 4-H youth member must have at least one club to be marked active and valid.

Note: Members at Large (Youth members who do not belong to a club) should select the "Member at Large" club option.

Adult Volunteers: If you are a club volunteer - select your club from the drop-down bar. If you are **not** a club volunteer - skip this section - by clicking *Continue*.
