Entries & Payments

- Entries and payments must be submitted online via Showman. Log onto https://showman.app/shows#/ and search for "Evin Evans Spring Spectacular Dairy Goat Show" to make your entries, pay entry fees, reserve pens, order extra shavings, or reserve camper hookups.
- Exhibitors are responsible for making entries and substitutions on Showman by 8 PM on Friday, May 24.

Entry Fees

- Open Bucks, Open Senior Does, and Open Junior Does: \$6 per ring.
- Youth Combined Doe Show and showmanship Classes: No entry fee.

Pens & Bedding

- 5' x 5' pens are \$6 each and must be reserved with payment on Showman no later than Friday, May 24.
- Exhibitors may remove center partitions to create larger pens.
- The show committee will arrange layout and assign pens to maximize space. If there is another exhibitor you would like to be penned adjacent to, please indicate so on Showman.
- No tack pens may be reserved, but there will be ample space in the aisles for chairs, tack, and supplies.
- Weathers Livestock Arena now has a concrete floor. Pens will have base bedding of fine-textured pine shavings. Exhibitors may pre-order additional bagged shavings from the show (\$10 per 10 ft³ bag) or bring their own.

Show Order, Approved Sanctions and Judges

To expedite and synchronize the shows, the show order and ring assignments will be determined by show officials based on the number of entries in each breed and are subject to change. Any such changes will be posted prominently at ringside and announced in the barn prior to show time.

Youth Showmanship

If you plan to compete in showmanship during the YOUTH SHOW, list the appropriate class on your Entry Form

- A. Junior Showmanship: exhibitors 9 and under day of show
- B. Intermediate Showmanship: exhibitors 10-15 years day of show
- C. Senior Showmanship: exhibitors 16-20 years day of show
- D. Non-competitive and non-sanctioned showmanship class for youth or adults with special needs. Participants are permitted to borrow an animal from another exhibitor to show in this class.

The **Youth Combined Doe Show** will be divided by breeds according to the number of entries received, with each breed assigned to a specific judge for placing. Any changes to the show order will be posted prominently at ringside and announced in the barn prior to show time. The show is subject to all other rules and regulations as stated for the Open Shows.

ADGA Sanctioned Open Dairy Goat Shows

-Open to the World-

All Shows **ARE** sanctioned separately by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. Only ADGA, AGS and CGS registered, recorded or applied-for animals may be shown in an official American Dairy Goat Association show.

- The base date for computing ages is the respective date of show. There is no pre-show milk-out.
- The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.
- The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all
 animals under six months of age and this MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the
 show.
- No copies of registration certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegrams or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.
- All animals entering the grounds must be healthy. Health papers are not required for animals originating
 in North Carolina. For out-of-state animals, health certificates are required, as well as negative brucellosis
 and TB tests within 30 days or herd certifications and accreditation unless animals are from states that
 are certified "TB and Brucellosis Free" by the USDA (check with your veterinarian).
- If your animal is awarded a GCH or RGCH, you must have your registration papers available for immediate viewing by the judge. Please verify all information on the official show sheet prior to signing the Report of Awards.
