#### Wilson County 4-H Summer Fun Policies

- Be sure to check age requirements and locations as you review activities in which to enroll your child. Please come by the Wilson County Agricultural Center to complete the appropriate forms and pay related fees to finalize registration for all workshops <u>as soon as possible</u>. Waiting lists will be available after camps fill up. Fees cover insurance and supplies. Camp fees are <u>not</u> refundable. Space is limited, so once enrolled, your child is expected to attend and participate. You must let us know 24 hours in advance if your child can no longer attend a registered camp.
  - Please keep track of which camps your child has signed up for. If he/she cannot make the camp, please let Joy, Jessica, or Kenyatta know at least 24 hours in advance before the camp occurs. We have waiting lists and would like to offer that space to another child. You may receive an email 1-3 days before the camp as a confirmation from Wilson County 4-H. Do not rely on this as a reminder.
  - The start and end times for these events are to be strictly enforced. Please do not drop off your child more than 15 minutes prior to the camp starting and pick them up no more than 15 minutes past the end time.
  - Payments MUST be paid in FULL at time of registration. If you are on the waiting list and get a call saying a space has opened, you must present payment when arriving for camp. If you would like to apply for a 4-H camp scholarship, please ask for a form at registration. These are limited and go to those in highest need.
  - Due to NC law, 4-H staff is not allowed to apply or supply sunscreen or insect repellent to your child. If the camp is taking place outside, please be sure to supply your child sunscreen/insect repellent and teach him/her to properly apply it.
  - Also due to NC law, 4-H staff are <u>not allowed to supply or install car seats</u>. If a car seat or booster seat is needed, please provide one and place in the 4-H van. Your child's safety is very important to us!
  - Wilson County Extension and 4-H are not responsible for any lost or stolen items. Joy will keep a lost and found box if something is left behind. Call or email her to pick it up.
