**2014 State 4-H Volunteer Leader Conference-** is set for January 31st-February 2nd at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel in Research Triangle Park. Additional registration information will be coming soon so please let Ashley know by January 2nd if you are interested in going.

**4-H Awards Night-** is scheduled for **Tuesday, January 28 from 7:00-8:30 pm** at the **CVCC-Alexander County Center (Room 103).** Awards for project books, presentations, cumulative records and judging/bowl teams will be presented. All new club and county 4-H officers will be installed. All new 4-H club members will officially become members.

South Central Winter Enrichment- is planned for January 10th -11th in Union County. We will be leaving the Extension Office in Taylorsville promptly at 4:00 pm and will be stopping for dinner before our 7:00 pm arrival in Union County. The evening will begin with a business meeting, followed by 2 consecutive workshops and then a group outing at the bowling alley. Cost is \$10 for adults and \$20 for youth. Adults will not be bowling. Youth will need to bring an additional \$5 for dinner. A snack on Friday evening and Saturday breakfast is provided. Please register as soon as possible in the Extension office, as there are only 90 spots for this event for the District and it will be filled on a first come first served basis.

**2014 Summer Camp Date-** Alexander County 4-H'ers will be traveling to **Betsy-Jeff Penn** for a week of summer camp- **July 20-25, 2014**, for youth ages 8-14. Your cost will be \$430 which includes all camper fees, camp t-shirt, \$15 store money, transportation, and meals while at camp. We will need a \$50 deposit to hold your space by **February 1**st. We will return all unclaimed spots after February 1st. The remainder of the balance is due **June 16th**. Please keep in mind, we only have 5 male and 5 female spaces available.

**2014 Teen Retreat-** Save the Date-This upcoming year's Teen Retreat will be held on April 4th-5th at Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Camp. More information will be sent out as we receive it.



**4-H Photo Contest-** Get together or start taking your best photos taken since *March 1, 2013*. You may enter one photo per category... people, animals, landscapes, buildings, 4-H in Action, Nature's Beauty, and Family Traditions. County photo winners in the 9-18 year old divisions for the last 3 categories will be sent on to the state 4-H photo contest. Overall county points winner will receive \$15 4-H Scholarship. The photo contest entry form is included in this newsletter. Deadline for photo entries is February 28th.

Winter Wonderland With 4-H- Catawba County 4-H has invited us to join them on Friday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, for a day of winter fun and learning. The morning will feature some Winter Workshops on Science, 4-H Presentation Basics and Healthy Lifestyles. Bring a lunch and warm-up with some hot chocolate and then we will head to Pineville for ice skating in the afternoon. 4-H membership is not necessary to attend. This event is for youth ages 8-13 and the cost is \$18. Register by calling the Extension Center by January 14; payment due at time of registration. 4-H'ers may use scholarship money they have earned to pay for the day. Cost includes skating and skate rental. (This is during Catawba County's school break; however, unfortunately, Alexander County is not out of school this day, leaving this event to apply more to home-schooled youth.)



ACT Preparation Course set- Want some help preparing for the ACT? Nervous about testing? Attend the ACT Prep class known as ASPIRE (ACT Preparation in Rural Education) for 10th and 11<sup>th</sup> graders. The ASPIRE program is designed to bridge deficits in rural high school students' performance on the ACT College Entrance Examination in order to increase the number of students pursuing higher education in agriculture and life sciences. This is a cooperative initiative through the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at North Carolina State University and North Carolina Cooperative Extension.

The program includes The Princeton Review ACT study manual, The Princeton Review 1,296 practice question manual, 4 ACT full length practice exams with score analysis and breakdown, The Princeton Review selective college admissions booklet, and 30 hours of class time instruction, where students will learn the skills they need to be able to tackle the ACT!

The cost is \$165 - you can qualify to get \$65 (or a portion) refunded if you attend all the classes and completes all the practice tests. The cost includes 4 practice tests, 2 ACT manuals, and instruction. Financial Aid/Scholarships are available. Students are also eligible to attend a special ASPIRE Day at NCSU. The course will be held at the Alexander County Extension Office. The deadline for program applications is January 9<sup>th</sup>. Everyone must register online, so please visit the ASPIRE website at http://harvest.cals.ncsu.edu/aspire/ for more information and to access the application. Please feel free to contact the Alexander County Extension Center for more information and a course schedule at 828-632-4451. The course is set to begin Saturday, January 18, from 8:00 am -12:00 pm, with a pre-test, regular classes will begin the following week!

4-H Portfolios (formerly Cumulative Records) Due- If you are 13 years or older and have been active in a specific project book area for 2-3 years, then you may want to consider completing a cumulative record. The form is similar to a 4-H project book but covers your work in that area for the past 3 years. If you are interested in beginning your 4-H cumulative record, call the 4-H office for more information. Deadline for 4-H Cumulative Records to the 4-H Office is February 24th. Cash prizes are provided at the state level up to \$150. Many of our local 4-H'ers have received this prize money.

**4-H Achievement Plans Due-** If you have been working on a 4-H Achievement Plan, please bring it to the 4-H Center by **January 10th**. An Achievement Plan awards a 4-H'er each year for accomplishing certain activities in 4-H. Many of you have completed the 1<sup>st</sup> level this year. Call the 4-H Center if you would like to receive an Achievement Plan.

**4-H College Scholarships Due-** If you are graduating in 2014 from high school, you may want to check out the 4-H college scholarships that are available. Call the 4-H Office to receive a scholarship packet. Scholarship information is due on **Wednesday, January 29th** to the 4-H Office.

**4-H Honor Club Applications Due-** If your 4-H age is 16 on *January 1st*, you are eligible to apply for the NC 4-H Honor Club. Only ½ of 1 percent of North Carolina's total membership are inducted each year. Applications are due to 4-H Office by **Friday**, **January 24th**.

Club of the Year Points-please remember to be calculating your club of the year points and have them submitted to Ashley by January 19th. Please feel free to call or come by the office for assistance if you need help with this.

- 3) Contestants may submit one recent photograph in one or more of the following categories: (a) People (b) Animals (c) Landscapes (d) Buildings (e) 4-H in Action (f) Nature's Beauty (g) Family Traditions. County winners in the 9-18 divisions will be eligible for the State 4-H Photo Contest.
- 4) The photograph can be color or black and white prints, 4 X 6 inches no larger.
- 5) Pictures must be taken by the youth since March, 2013.
- 6) Pictures may be brought to the Alexander 4-H Center by February 28, 2013.
- 7) Ribbons will be awarded in each category and age division. First place will receive four (4) points, second place--three (3) points, third place--two (2) points, and one (1) point for participation. The person scoring highest overall points will receive a \$15 4-H Scholarship.
- 8) Attach an entry form with the pictures you enter.
