Youth from across the country will participate in Drone Discovery, the 4-H NYSD 2016 Engineering Design Challenge. Drone Discovery was developed by Cornell University Cooperative Extension. It's a handson engineering design challenge that explores the science behind drones and how they are being used to solve real world problems. Youth will learn everything from flight dynamics and aircraft types, to safety and

regulations, to remote sensing and flight control. West Elementary School teacher, Mr. Rich Harvey, will present this program and lead the discussion. Please let us know if you are interested in participating, space is limited.
