ONLINE Registration Date/Time

Policy and Procedures

The following forms **MUST** be filled out or on file for each child: 4-H Enrollment form, Code of Conduct (read and initial the enrollment form), Summer Fun registration form, and **NOTARIZED** Medical Release form turned in (not postmarked) by May 29th or you forfeit your child's space in the camp. Refunds/Cancellations

*All fees are non-refundable unless the class is cancelled.

Refunds for cancelled workshops will be processed within 3 weeks after cancellation notice. In the event of a cancellation, you will be notified as soon as possible.

Punctuality

*Parents/guardians must sign the child in and out each day of camp.

Participants should arrive **no more than 10 minutes prior** to the start time of each activity, and should be picked up **no later than 10 minutes after** the activity is scheduled to end. There will be a \$5 service fee for youth who arrive more than 10 minutes before the start of the activity and are picked up more than 10 minutes after each activity.

When transportation is provided to another location for a program, participants who arrive **more than 5 minutes late will be left and no refund will be given.**

***Because of car seat laws, transportation for 5-7 year olds will not be provided by 4-H.**

Junior Master Gardener Workshop

June 22nd – 26th

9:00 a.m.- 12Noon

Location: 4-H Office

22nd - We will: plant seeds, create a site survey, develop a drawing of our gardens and complete a soil identification project. We will also cover IPM and identify beneficial and pest insects.

23rd - We will: practice paper pot construction and planting of seeds as well as discuss companion gardening. Today we will have a guest come and speak and we can ask about their career in nutrition and health.

24th - We will: discuss container gardening and plant an herb garden in a 5-gallon bucket. Then we will create a seed bank and learn about saving seeds from our own produce. Also, we will also focus on a project where we can give back to our community. We will brainstorm ideas on how to conserve resources and use seed saving techniques to benefit local citizens or fundraising opportunities for charities.

25th - We will: learn food safety tips on cleaning your harvest, learning how to eat in season and discovering molds on spoiled foods. We will also practice reading food nutrition labels. We will do a Junk Food Blues activity.

26th - We will: be making healthy snacks from the garden and taste testing fruits and veggies from the garden. We will learn which nutrients come from which plants. We will also make a finger paint discovery about foods with fiber.

At the end of the week, those students who attend every day will earn the Jr. Master Gardener Certificate.

We will eat before getting on the boat at 10:30AM and then again when we get back at 1:30PM so we can spend our full time on the island doing activities.
