




US Flue-Cured Exports and Domestic Disappearance




US Flue-Cured Domestic Disappearance and Imports for Consumption






US Flue-Cured Exports and Domestic Disappearance and Production



Slowing of the Chinese Economy


Chinese import growth has slowed sharply

China: Real GDP and import volumes




U.S. Unmanufactured <u>Exports</u> of Flue-Cured Tobacco (stemmed) (lbs farm weight)

- Does increased imported tobacco use account for the decline in use of US flue-cured?
- Is the steep decline due to inventory changes and anticipation of future steep declines in US cigarette consumption?
- Some combination??


What's happening to exports?

- Continued declines in smoking in developed countries
- Unfavorable exchange rates
- Are Chinese smokers slowing (or reversing) their switch to more premium cigarettes?

So...what happened to contracts?

- Some purchases were moved because of mergers
- Exchange rates favor production in Brazil
- Is the existence of auctions affecting contracted pounds?
