
#### **Outstanding 4-H Member Award**

<u>Outstanding Individual</u> - (Boy or Girl) - Ten percent of the total enrollment for each club may be nominated. It will be the discretion of the leader to determine the number of boy and girl entries for the club. Areas for judging Outstanding Boy or Girl include: 4-H project work, contest participation, community service, leadership activities, and enthusiasm for the 4-H program. Emphasis is placed on quality, not quantity of activities done or prizes won. An individual may win this award only once in each division. A group of "Honorable Mentions" (where recognition is deserved) will also be given.

#### 4-H Volunteer Leaders' Association Conference

The 2017 State 4-H Volunteer Leaders' Association Conference will be held on February 3-5, 2017 at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel in Raleigh. There aren't a lot of details other than the dates available just yet, but this is an awesome opportunity for our leaders to get some valuable training to assist in running their clubs. To maintain a charter with North Carolina 4-H, leaders are required to attend at least one Extension provided training session each year.





Mark your calendars for February 18, 2017 for the annual 4-H Achievement Day. This year's theme is "Mardi Gras". The Jr. Leader Club will serve as emcee at this year's event and they are planning an awesome time for everyone!

### 4-Her of the Year Award

Packets for the 4-Her of the Year Award are available at the 4-H office. Packets are also available from 4-H leaders. Please read the following carefully. All portions of the packet must be turned in by **Tuesday**, **January 3**, **2017**.

This award will recognize a male and female Senior 4-H'er of the Year (ages 14 to 18 as of January 1) and a male and female Junior 4-H'er of the Year (ages 9 to 13 as of January 1). The winners of these awards will represent the Rowan County 4-H Program throughout 2017.

Criteria to be used in judging will be the applicant's 4-H career, participation on various levels (county, district, state, etc.), leadership abilities, and how well the 4-H'er exemplifies the qualities of 4-H. Winners will be chosen by a panel of judges and will be announced at the annual 4-H Achievement Night. Once you have earned 4-H'er of the Year in an age division, you are ineligible to receive the award again in that age division.

There are three parts to this process:

- •Complete the application with the help of your parents and leaders. Make sure it is neat and legible.
- •Submit up to ten pages (or 5 pages front to back) of awards, photos, personal stories, etc. that represent your 4-H career.
- •Attend an interview with the panel of judges. Applicants should dress appropriately and be prepared to answer the judges' questions, plus give an introduction of themselves and why 4-H is important to them. Each applicant will also be given the opportunity to make closing remarks and to thank the committee for their time.

#### **Outstanding Club Award**

<u>Outstanding Club</u> - One or more clubs in each age division will receive an Outstanding Club certificate. Areas for judging outstanding clubs include 4-H activities, community service projects, and community study activities. Emphasis is placed on the quality of the club's total program, not on the quantity of things done. Activities covered on the Outstanding Club application form must be from the current club year. A club may win this award as many times as they are deemed worthy of it. In the event that no club in a given division is deemed worthy of the award, no certificate will be given in that division for the year.
